New Year, New Kids, New Teachers

We offer a very warm welcome to our beautiful new students throughout the school and their families. We hope you enjoy and make the most of your time in our wonderful small school. We also welcome teachers new to our school who will be assisting this year. Welcome Mrs Sprague, Mrs Clare and Miss Roberts.

Anaphylaxis: Just letting all families know that we do have some students at school this year with severe food allergies... in particular nuts/eggs. We have spoken to the children about not sharing any food items and being mindful of what they are eating/alternative choices, and with whom they are sitting. I look forward to parent support in this matter.

Our Staff: Mrs Moss is our School Administrative Manager (SAM) working on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays (half day); Mrs Sprague is teaching Library on Mondays as well as Learning Support; Mrs Clare is teaching PDHPE on Tuesdays as well as Learning Support; K/1/2 have Miss Roberts on Wednesdays (Principal's Release time); Mrs McLennan has Years 3-6 and I have K/1/2. Our School Learning Support Officer (SLSO) is Bec Mills. ..days to be nominated shortly. Mr Tyszyk is our General Assistant (GA) and works at our school on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We have a school counsellor visit for half a day every 2nd Friday–Ms Grunsell– and is available by appointment through the front office or class teacher.

Best Start Assessments: Our 9 Kindy students have participated in Literacy assessments for Best Start and this Wednesday will give us the opportunity for aspects of Numeracy. It is wonderful to see students new to the school, and school situations, feeling so at ease during this process as they felt supported by their friendship partners in this setting. Well done Yrs 1 and 2 in supporting our Kindies and well done Kindy for such a fine start to your schooling. The valuable information gleaned from this assessment not only gives us baseline data but allows us insights into individual strengths and areas of greater need or support. Reporting to parents should be forthcoming before week 5 of this term.

Swimming Carnival: This year we will again be combining with Hillside PS and Annangrove PS in our annual swimming carnival on **Friday 15th February**. As usual this event will be held at Galston Aquatic Centre. Students from K-6 participate in this event. Parents are requested to take their child directly to the pool **by 9.15** and pick them up from the pool **at around 2pm**. Of course parents are always welcome, and indeed encouraged, to stay and cheer their children on!! A special note explaining procedures will come home shortly.
