Schools and early childhood education and care services, including Out Of School Hours Care services are open for any child that needs it." Thank you for your support.

We, as a staff, have also been advised to restrict our numbers, so you will not always see those familiar cars in the carpark for all hours of the day and night, nor those familiar faces you are expecting at school. Over the next two weeks we will have minimal staff on site... some at school to meet the needs of children of essential workers and some will be working from home. We appreciate your support in this crucial time. We have already noticed a significant drop in numbers of students attending.

This is a very special place and we will be developing our own set of expectations when all of our students are back on the premises. We will be using the Landcare Grant to assist with the planting out and mulching of this area.

Student Packages and Google Classroom: Attendance is marked each day by an indication that work sent home is being completed. This is visible to us through responses in Google Classroom along with activity visible on Matific, Reading Eggs and Study Ladder. If there has been no "action" from your child in any of these areas, you will receive a phone call from your child's teacher to see if we can help in any way. The work set is not just "busy work" but set from Teacher programs for this term. We expect the work to be attempted. Any issues can be discussed with your child's teacher. Please DO NOT STRESS over anything! Reach out to us. We are here to support both you and your child through this difficult time.
